

IRREGULAR VERBS : **eō, īre** (*go*); **ferō, ferre, tuli, lātum** (*bring, bear, carry, say*) : indicative and subjunctive
 These verbs frequently appear in compound forms, e.g. **abeō, referō**, etc.

PLUPERFECT ACTIVE

* These alternative endings may appear in any of the six persons (*I, you, she, etc.*).

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I To go does not have a passive in English.* However, **eō, īre** does appear in the passive, impersonally, in the 3rd person singular present (**itur**) and perfect, **itum est**, meaning *there is/was a going*, i.e. *people (or whoever is mentioned) go*.

fertur and **feruntur** (and **ferunt** in the active) often mean *say, report*: i.e., *is said, are said, they say*

* Many compounds of intransitive verbs are transitive (i.e. take direct objects), and therefore appear in the passive; e.g. **adeō,-īre** (*approach, enter on, undertake*)
